EAP Program Description: The EAP program is composed of six levels. The six levels are taught in several modalities consisting of four courses and two labs. It is not necessary for a student to take all six courses in one semester. The EAP+ pathway was implemented alongside the current EAP program in spring 2014. EAP+ consists of two integrated course blocks (one in Writing & Grammar, and the other in Reading & Listening/Speech) plus one concurrent enrollment from a selected college level course. EAP Placement Criteria: Students without sufficient English proficiency take an

MDC approved English placement test ACUPLACER/ESL and are placed in designated English for Academic Purposes (EAP) courses. This includes students with foreign degrees earned from accredited institutions where the language of instruction is not English. Students may take the ACCUPLACER/ESL test once for initial placement. Retesting must occur prior to enrollment or before the last date to drop the class with a refund. Continuing EAP students in the 0400 level or above in all four skill areas shall take the reading and writing portion of the PERT test after the last withdrawal date of the term for advisement into advanced EAP levels (or ENC 1101) in the following term.

New incoming students whose ACUPLACER/ESL subtest scores in Reading, Grammar, and e-Write place them into the EAP 1585/1586 and/or 1685/1686 levels shall take the PERT Test prior to registering for EAP courses or before the last date to drop the class with a refund. Please note that EAP students who take the PERT test (for their first time) may take the mathematics subtest on its own. However, they must take the reading and writing subtest at the same time.

Students who completed the six levels of all required EAP courses can progress to ENC1101.

Which steps are required to be able to register for EAP courses at MDC?

1. ADMISSIONS/READMISSIONS - You must Re-apply after one year hiatus and wait 48 hours.
2. FINANCIAL AID/SCHOLARSHIPS – A way for students to finance their classes.
3. NELNET - Make College Easier to Pay For with a Tuition Payment Plan (optional).
4. TESTING WITH ACCUPLACER - Test with most recent scores/expires after two years.
5. EAP ADVISEMENT – Available in Academic Affairs Room 1218.
